1.3. Administrative Experience

(a) The head of Department

- Currently, I am Head, Religious Studies and Philosophy, Gulu University from 1st August, 2022.
- Was Head of Philosophy Department, Makerere University from 2013 to 2017.
- As a head of department, I ensured the smooth teaching, examining, supervising and mentoring of students enrolled on six academic programs running in the Department: B.A. in Philosophy, B.A. Ethics and Human Rights, M.A. Philosophy, MA. Human Rights, M. Phil in Applied Ethics, and PhD program.

- This department had more than 1,200 enrolled students with about 20 members of staff both full time and part time staff.
- About 300 of these students go for internship every year and we make sure they are supervised and their field reports are marked.
- We held regular meetings and work in smaller committees to ensure efficiency.
- Each program had a coordinator who reports directly to the head of department and sees the day to day running of each program.

(b) Patron of Philosophy Society (2002-2008)

- Every week we hold Symposiums, where both MA students and staff present papers for discussions. Some of these papers are peer reviewed and later published in recognized journals.
- Every year during World Philosophy Day, we organize workshops, where papers are presented by invited guests and staff members of the department. Several papers have been published out of these presented papers.
- Collaborated with UNESCO, and other Civil Society Organizations who from time to time funded these activities.

(c) Departmental Examination Coordinator from 2005-2010

- As examination coordinator, I supervised the entire examination exercise in the department. Under the directive of the head of department then, we monitored every examination process, from the moment of setting, vetting, sitting examinations and marking of these examinations by both internal and external examiners.

(d) Member of Examinations Irregularity Committee (Faculty of Arts - 2004-2008)

- As member of this committee we regulated examination malpractices in the Faculty of Arts, seeing a number of students dismissed or punished for examination malpractices. This helped to improve the quality of examination management.

(e) Coordinator of a cross-cutting PhD course (PHI 9102: Philosophy of Methods)

- From 2008 to 2016 when I have been coordinator of this course, we trained over 200 PhD candidates from all over Uganda in philosophy of methods.
- Attracted funding from SLU University of Agriculture and Food Science (Sweden) to train over 80 PhD students from Nigeria, Tanzania, Rwanda, South Africa and Uganda in Philosophy of Methods.
- Attracted funds from Doctoral Academy from the University of Stellenbosch in South Africa, that trained 50 students from 18 – 29th April, 2016.
- Trained staff members from Makerere in Supervision skills and research ethics in 2014.
- We have been invited to train 70 PhD students from the Kampala International University (KIU) from all their campuses in East Africa.

(f) Patron of Makerere University Ethics and Human Rights Association (MUEHRA)

- Wrote the constitution with the student interim leaders
- Every year we hold Human Rights EXPO – in collaboration with Civil Society Organizations (CSO) and Makerere University Ethics and Human Rights Association (MUEHRA), an associated initiated in the department for students of Ethics and Human Rights.
- We regularly hold public debates on topical issues affecting our country. Last one held was a seminar on Public Management Law and its Implications on Human Rights in Uganda. Participants were drawn from both the academia and government policy makers.

(g) A member of Faculty of Arts' Research and Publication Committee (2008-2010)

- Received and approved research and publication applications and recommend those of high quality for sponsorships.
- (h) Member of (Sida) Program Implementation Committee (PIC)**
- This committee over saw the entire implementation of the Sida III from 2010 to 2015.
 - As a committee we regularly met to plan, distribute and evaluate the requisition, allocations and accountabilities of a very big Sida fund worth 250 million U.S dollars.
 - This was crowned with an award of excellence performance to the PIC members by the Vice Chancellor of Makerere University in 2015. I was one of those given this award.
- (i) Coordinator of Sida III program (2010-2015)**
- I coordinated three departmental sub-programs: Philosophy, Mass Communication and Geography.
 - During this time we saw a big number of publications that led to promotions of the members of staff on this program coming out of these three departments.
 - Organized trainings in ethics and integrity for four pilot districts in Uganda: Gulu, Mbale, Masaka and Mbarara.
 - Formed an interim Uganda National Ethics and Integrity Committee (UNEIC) to work with the Directorate of Ethics and Integrity in the President’s Office.
 - Wrote a Training Manual in Ethics and Integrity.
 - We supervised and facilitated two PhD candidates from Philosophy and Mass Communication departments from 2010-2015.
- (j) Member of the College Procurement Committee(2014-2016)**
- In this committee, we receive procurement invoices, vet and determine which supplier to provide the procurement services needed by the College.
- (k) Chairperson of the Separation Committee - SLPA and SLLC.**
- I was the chairperson for the separation of School of Liberal and Performing Arts (SLPA) and School of Languages, Literature and Communication (SLLC).
 - As chair of this committee, I guided the several meetings that looked at the policy of the university, identified the place and role of the different units within the college.
 - Identified offices and assets that belonged to the College and recommended how they should be used, managed or administered by different units, especially the two schools that at one time was one big faculty.

- I was a member of a visitation committee to the department of Performing Arts and Film (PAF) when it had problems that needed to be investigated.
 - We did our investigations and made recommendations to the Dean Faculty of Arts.

- I participated in the review of university programs carried out by the National Curriculum Development Centre (NCDC) to evaluate and recommend academic programs of all Universities in Uganda.
 - This was done in Jinja for several days. I learnt a lot on the requirements of academic programs that were meaningful and recommended at a university level.

- (o) Member of College Academic Board, College of Humanities and Social Sciences (CHUSS), Makerere University from 2014 to 2018.**
- In April 2014, I was appointed member of the College Academic Board.

- This board sits regularly to review management of academic programs at different units.
- Often we recommended to the units concerned to take a serious review of their academic programs.

(p) Member of College Finance, Planning, Estate and Security Committee

- In July 2014, I was appointed member of the College Finance, Planning, Estate and Security Committee.
- This committee collects units' budgets, analyses them and makes college budgets in line with available funds.
- The committee plans for the entire college, not only in terms of finances, but also in terms of estates and security.

(q) Coordinator of Research Projects in the Department

- As a head of department, I coordinate all research activities in the Department.
- The department has one periodical which they published regularly: African Journal of Ethics and Human Rights, and so far we have produced two volumes: 1 and 2
- I ensure articles are collected and vetted before they are forwarded to different publishing houses.
